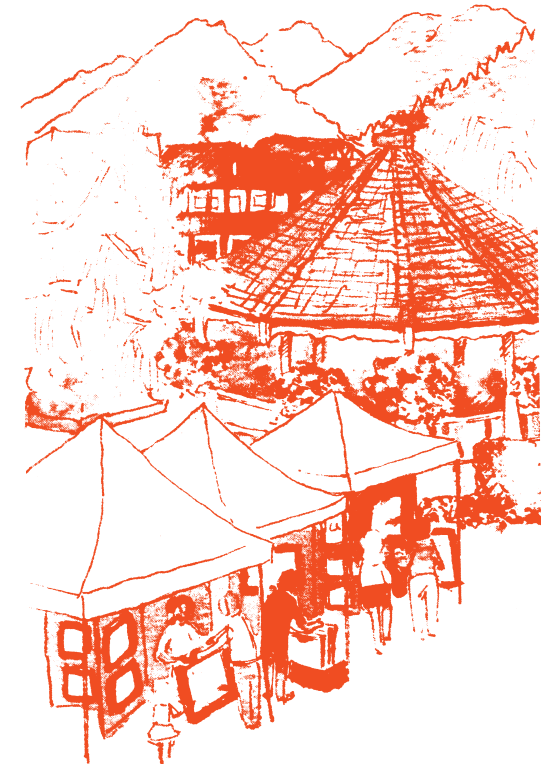

- ◆ Participation is open to professional and amateur artists, alike. Village Art in the Park accepts submissions in all brush media, hand thrown and hand built pottery, metal work, jewelry, wood, glass, fiber, printmaking, photography, sketching, and portrait work. All elements of art submitted and displayed for sale must be original to the artist in concept, design and execution—and should demonstrate the artist’s creativity and workmanship. The content of the displayed artwork must be appropriate for all ages.
- ◆ The work of all applicants, regardless of prior participation, will be juried each year. Along with the application, all applicants must submit a \$15 jury fee as well as a minimum of 3 photos of their work which are representative of the art intended to be displayed and sold, and one photo of their display. Application materials are accepted through the online application form, via email, or via parcel.
- ◆ To keep the show fresh and maintain the interest of the consumers, Village Art in the Park expects artists participating in successive seasons to present new artwork annually.
- ◆ The Village Art in the Park Board of Directors reserves the right to accept or reject all applications. A letter of acceptance or rejection will be returned to the artist in a timely fashion.
- ◆ A \$35 exhibitor’s fee is charged per weekend to help cover the cost of overnight security.
- ◆ Village Art in the Park handles all art sales and retains 21% commission. Payouts to artists will be made by direct deposit the week following a weekend showing.
- ◆ Artists are treated as independent contractors. An IRS Form W-9 is required of each participating artist and a Form 1099 will be sent to participants annually for income tax reporting purposes.
- ◆ The Park Manager will assign booth locations using a lottery system. Each artist will be assigned a 10’x10’ or 10’x20’ space. Booth assignments change weekly.
- ◆ Village Art in the Park normal business hours are:
 - Thursdays (July & Aug): 9am - 5pm
 - Fridays & Saturdays: 9am - 6pm
 - Sundays: 10am - 6pm
 - Mondays (Holidays): 10am - 6pm
- ◆ Artists must have a standard 10’x10’ or 10’x20’ white canopy made from certified fire resistant materials. Each canopy must be weighted with a minium of 35# per leg. No exceptions.
- ◆ Artists must display clearly visible signage stating the artist’s name or business name, and must be at least 144 sq. inches in size. All signage must be confined to the inside of the booth and be professional in appearance.
- ◆ Artists are required to be present for a minimum of two days in any weekend in which they participate, and favor will be given to those that can participate fully.
- ◆ Artists must be present in their booths during hours of operation. In the event that an artist needs to step away from their booth for more than a few minutes they must assign a knowledgeable adult to stand in their place.
- ◆ Prints, note cards, and stickers of original work may be sold. Spinner racks are permitted but must be confined to the interior of the booth.
- ◆ In the event of a policy violation, the Executive Director, in consultation with the Board of Directors, reserves the right to take immediate action. Village Art in the Park may restrict or remove any exhibit or artist deemed unsuitable or objectionable. Plagiarized or misrepresented artwork is grounds for immediate dismissal.
- ◆ Village Art in the Park is a nonprofit organization. A portion of the commission collected on the sale of art is used to provide funds for art scholarships and financial support for art education in local K-12 schools.
- ◆ Village Art in the Park is not responsible for stolen artwork. Artists may choose to require verification of payment before releasing artwork to customers. Overnight security is provided, but it is recommended that small and high dollar items are taken out of the Park at night.
- ◆ Smoking, including the use of e-cigarettes or vape pens, is not allowed within the footprint of Village Art in the Park.
